
Outward Disciplines: SIMPLICITY


2. CLARITY






"See, this alone I found, that God made human beings simple, but they have devised many schemes." (Ecclesiastes 7:29)

"When the kingdom of God is genuinely placed first, ecological concerns, the poor, the equitable distribution of wealth, and other things will be given their proper attention. As Jesus made clear in our central passage, freedom from anxiety is one of the inward evidences of seeking first the kingdom of God. The inward reality of simplicity involves a life of joyful unconcern for possessions. Neither the greedy nor the miserly know this liberty. It has nothing to do with abundance of possessions or their lack. It is an inward spirit of trust. The sheer fact that a person is living without things is no guarantee that he or she is living in simplicity." — Richard Foster

Consider how this could impact stewardship campaigns!



SIMPLICITY

The Outward Expressions: 10 Principles to try

- 1. By for usefulness rather than to impress.
- 2. Reject anything that produces addiction.
- 3. Periodically GIVE things away.
- 4. Refuse to be propaganda by the custodians of modern gadgetry.
- 5. Enjoy things without feeling the need to own them.
- 6. Appreciate creation/nature.
- 7. Avoid buy now/pay later plans.
- 8. Keep speech plain and honest.
- 9. Reject anything that breeds the oppression of others.
- 10. Shun anything that distracts you from your primary pursuit of the kingdom.
